All Exhibitors must comply with all Washington County Ag Expo & Fair rules and regulations. Failure to comply may disqualify the entry and require that it be removed from the fairgrounds.

Department 4A – Dairy Cattle

- 1) General Rules & Regulations
 - a) All dairy cattle must be registered with the respective breed associations. Registration papers are required.
 - b) Dairy cattle exhibited as 2 year-olds and older must have been owned by the exhibitor before 2 years of age.
 - c) Any 4-H/FFA member exhibiting for the first time may have minimal assistance from their parents or an immediate family member. No other assistance in fitting will be allowed.
 - d) Exhibitors will be permitted to substitute 1 animal for another either in the same class or in a different class within the breed.
 - e) Champion Showmanship Class will include current age group showmanship champions and previous years' champion showmanship exhibitors.
 - f) Showmanship awards are donated by Ralph & Terrie Shank, Palmyra Farm.
 - g) A Best Bred and Owned Heifer and Cow of the 4-H show will be selected by the judge. The animal must be bred and currently owned by the 4-H exhibitor to be eligible. The best bred and owned cow and heifer can be any registered dairy breed. A \$100 cash award will be given to both the exhibitor of the best bred and owned heifer as well as the best bred and owned cow. Hannah Smith will present the award at Ag-Expo each year to the exhibitors.

All Exhibitors must comply with all Washington County Ag Expo & Fair rules and regulations. Failure to comply may disqualify the entry and require that it be removed from the fairgrounds.

Department 4B – Beef Cattle

- 1) General Rules & Regulations
 - a) Beef Cattle
 - i) All purebreds must be registered with the respective breed associations. Registration papers are required.
 - ii) Each 4-H/FFA member may tag 3 animals, show 3 animals and sell 2 animals.
 - iii) As appropriate, animals must be dehorned and castrated prior to tag-in. If any questions arise, a veterinarian will be consulted.
 - iv) All steers must be born on or after January 1 of the previous year.
 - v) All animals must be shown to be eligible for sale.
 - vi) Animals must weigh a minimum of 1000 pounds and not exceed 1400 pounds to be shown. Animals on sale day must be sold at actual weight.
 - vii) Once a 4-H/FFA member wins a division showmanship championship, they must continue to compete in the overall championship, unless they are a junior or an intermediate junior, then the junior will show as an intermediate upon appropriate birthday and the intermediate junior will show as a senior upon appropriate birthday. Overall champion will compete in the previous winner class and will not be eligible to compete for overall champion.
 - viii) There will be no nose leads permitted during the 4-H/FFA beef show.

- ix) Champion and reserve champion steers must be sold at the market sale.
 - x) Contestants are responsible for providing their own fitting chutes.
 - xi) The 4-H/FFA beef cattle show committee will determine the class status of any questionable animal whether it should be shown as a purebred or crossbred. This decision will be made at the time the animal is tagged. The exhibitor has the right to appeal the decision within 30 days.
 - xii) Breed classes will be determined at tag in.
 - xiii) No adult assistance, other than one ring person who will assist the judge, will be allowed in the show ring during the show except for emergency situations. Lesser experienced exhibitors may request the assistance of an older exhibitor during breed classes if pre-approved by the superintendent. No assistance will be allowed during showmanship classes. If the animal cannot be controlled by the exhibitor and assistant, it will be excused from the ring. The judge will make the decision as to where the animal places based on his/her ability to judge the animal.
 - xiv) 4-H/FFA shows; showmanship, steers, and heifers; will be unfitted. This means washed and blown out with NO adhesives, paint, etc.
 - xv) Beef steers will be weighed for official show weight beginning at 7:00 AM on Sunday morning. All animals will be weighed at that time. No re-weights.
 - xvi) Exhibitors have the option of tying their animals outside during the night, provided they are tied very securely to trailers. Animals are not to be tied to wash racks, etc. If tied out, animals are not to be out of the barn before 8:45 PM and must be back in the barn by 8:00 AM.
- b) Texas Longhorns
- i) All steers must be registered with the International Texas Longhorn Association. No steers with pending registration will be accepted into the show.
 - ii) Exhibitors and owners competing at the fair must be members of ITLA.
 - iii) While exhibiting Texas Longhorns in the show ring, exhibitors will wear attire appropriate to the climate. No ball caps or tennis shoes and no written advertising on clothing.
 - iv) Exhibitors are expressly prohibited from altering the physical appearance or features of any Texas Longhorn, with the exception of the trimming of the prepuce hair of bulls.
 - v) Exhibitors are encouraged to bathe and brush, but not clip, their Texas Longhorn and present them in a neat and professional manner.
 - vi) Any Texas Longhorn found by the show chairman to be physically altered will be placed lower in class as per the judge's decision.
 - vii) No abrasive brushing at show sites.
 - viii) Judges will be chosen from the International Texas Longhorn Association list of approved judges.
 - iv) Exhibitors will be limited to two Texas Longhorns per class.
 - v) Nose leads are permitted.

- vi) 4-H/FFA members will show their project Texas Longhorn Steers in conjunction with the Open Class Show.
- vii) All calves must be at least 180 days old at the time of the show.
- c) Dairy Steers
 - i) Dairy steers must be 100% dairy breed.
 - ii) Each 4-H/FFA member may tag 3 animals and 3 animals may be shown in a current year.
 - iii) All project animals must be tagged and weighed per notification of the 4-H office.
 - iv) Dairy steers may be carried as a project for 2 years but will terminate on September 1st of the second year.
 - v) Animals must be dehorned and castrated 60 days prior to show time and be completely healed.
 - vi) All steers will be weighed after their arrival at the fair to determine weight classes.
 - vii) Classes will be divided by the weight to equalize the class.
 - viii) Steers may be up to but not over 2 years old.

Department 4C – Sheep & Lambs

- 1) General Rules & Regulations
 - a) Commercial Cross Bred Breeding Sheep
 - i) Eligible for all breeding classes.
 - ii) Animals will be shown slick shorn
 - b) Wool Fleece – Any producer may enter one fleece per breed provided the exhibitor owned the sheep at the time of shearing.
 - i) The fleece must have been shorn in the current year.
 - ii) The fleece must be tied with paper twine.
 - iii) Yearling fleece may have 12 months’ growth.
 - iv) Fleece must be entered by breed.
 - v) The fleece should be shorn from a sheep clearly representative of that breed.
 - vi) Preparation – Fleece should be rolled properly, flesh side out and tied with paper twine in such a way as to allow adequate handling, yet not affect the character or attractiveness. Each fleece must be tagged with the following: Name and address of exhibitor, breed, sex, number of month’s growth, and weight at fleece.
 - vii) 4C-14-1 – Purebred, Medium Wool – Chevoit, Corriedale, Dorset, Montdale, Hampshire, Shropshire, Southdown, Suffolk
 - viii) 4C-14-2 – Commercial White – May include wool from long wool purebreds which are not shown at Washington County and long wool purebreds that are shown at the State Fair (Romney, Boarder Leicester, Ramboulet, etc.)
 - ix) 4C-14-3 – Natural Colored, Medium Wool – (48-60) If fine wool fleeces were entered, they would be put in this class.
 - x) 4C-14-4 – Natural Colored, Long Wool – (36-28) If coarse wool fleeces were entered, they would be put in this class.
- 2) Registered 4-H/FFA – Department 4C
 - a) All market lambs must be tagged with a Maryland Livestock Tag.
 - b) All market lambs will be placed in designated area one-half hour prior to show. They will remain in this designated area for the duration of the show. The area will be restricted to 4-H/FFA exhibitors and superintendents only.

- c) Tail Docking Policy
- i) The 2011 Maryland 4-H Tail Docking Policy remains virtually unchanged from 2005. 4-H lambs should be docked no shorter than the distal end of the caudal tail fold. The caudal fold is a flap of skin attached to the underside of the tail near the rectum and is clearly visible when the tail is lifted.
 - ii) Lambs docked in this manner will have a minimum tail length of 0.7 inches at the time of show. Purchased lambs (market and breeding) should have a minimum tail length of 1.4 inches at the time of “weaning.” This gives a high probability that the lamb’s tail will measure a least 0.7 inches at the time of show. 4-Hers should use the DeTail device to select lambs that have been properly docked.
 - iii) In 2011, compliance with the Maryland 4-H Tail Docking Policy will be VOLUNTARY. Lamb tails (docks) will not be officially measured at Maryland 4-H activities. No lambs will be disqualified from showing due to tail length, unless the short dock results in a rectal prolapse.
 - iv) Lambs with purse-string sutures are ineligible for exhibition at 4-H shows.
 - v) Any sheep or lamb that exhibits a rectal prolapse at a 4-H activity will be ineligible for the activity and sent home by the Extension Educator, Sheep Superintendent, or other appropriately deemed individual. The following will be used as a guideline to determine occurrence of a rectal prolapse: “A rectal prolapse is defined as an inversion of the rectum that protrudes 4 cm (1.6 inches) or more outside the body and remains exterior to the body while the animal is standing.”
 - vi) If a lamb is observed with a rectal prolapse (by one of the above people) and in the future is not observed with a rectal prolapse, it is still classified as having a rectal prolapse. This was the criteria used in the 2003 multi-year study published in the Journal of Animal Science that established a scientific link between tail length and the incidence of rectal prolapses in lambs fed concentrate diets.

- d) Showmanship
- i) Exhibitor may use a market lamb or breeding sheep for this class.
- e) Breeding Sheep
- i) All breeding sheep must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor and must have been owned and registered with the breed association in the name of the exhibitor only by July 1 of the current year. A bill of sale is not acceptable. Registration papers and ear identification of animals will be checked by the superintendent. No joint ownership will be allowed.
 - ii) Ear tags must be in all breeding sheep upon arrival.
 - iii) Breeding animals must be shown in proper age category. Lambs may not be moved up.
 - iv) Exhibitors are permitted to make only two entries in each breeding sheep class. Include ear tag and registration number on entry blank.

- v) Exhibitors will be permitted to substitute a breeding animal within the same breed for another animal, either in the same class or in a different class.
 - vi) Senior ram and ewe lamb birth dates for all breeds will be between September 1 of the previous year and before December 31 of the previous year.
 - vii) Junior ram and ewe lamb birth dates for all breeds will be after January 1 of the current year for early lambs and after February 16 of the current year and on or before May 1 of the current year for late lambs.
 - viii) Rams may be brought in on the day of the show and will be released immediately after the show.
- f) Market Lambs
- i) Exhibitors may tag 4 market lambs, show 3 market lambs, and sell 2 market lambs.
 - ii) All market lambs must weigh a minimum of 90 pounds and not more than 150 pounds to be eligible for the show and sale. Re-weighs will not be permitted.
 - iii) Only ewes and wether lambs may be shown in market classes. All wether lambs must be completely healed. A show appointed veterinarian will examine any wether showing signs of testicle presence, unhealed scrotum, or other stag characteristics and will have the final decision in determining the eligibility for show.
 - iv) Grand & Reserve market lambs cannot be used in 4C-12-4 – Pair of Market Lambs.
 - v) All market lambs must be born after January 1 of the current year.
 - vi) Country bred lambs must be bred, born and purchased in Washington County.
 - vii) 4C-12-1 – Market Lambs will be weighed and divided into a maximum of classes of approximately equal weight distribution. See above rule for minimum and maximum weights.
- g) Shepherd's Lead Contest
- i) The sheep (Market lamb or a breeding animal) must be fitted and trained to show at halter.
 - ii) The entrant will be judged on mode of dress selected.
 - (a) The outfit must be attractive and lend elegance to the contest.
 - (b) The garment must be made of at least 60% wool.
 - (c) Entrants must furnish their own garment.
 - (d) Previously entered garments are not acceptable.
 - iii) The judges will use the following guide for judging:
 - (1) Wool outfit made or purchased. Credit will be given for home-sewn garments, hand-knitted, crocheted, or hand-woven.
 - (2) The contestant's own presentation and overall appearance (poise, fitting, etc.)
 - (3) Condition and overall appearance and attractiveness of the sheep (fitting, etc.)
 - (4) How well the sheep is halter trained and behaves in the show ring.
 - iv) Narratives are required and should include but not be limited to:
 - (1) A description of the outfit.
 - (2) Information about the animal being exhibited (name, breed, etc.)
 - (3) Other activities and interest of the exhibitor.

 - iii) Medium weight
 - iv) Heavy weight
 - v) Super heavy weight
 - f) County bred swine must be bred, born & purchased in Washington County
 - g) Weight should be 210-285 pounds.

 - c) All dairy goats must be owned and registered in the name of the exhibitor by June 1st of the current year except goats in the Junior Kid Class which must have registration papers or certification that application has been made.
 - d) All goats must be registered with approved goat association and all exhibitors must bring registration papers and present those papers for check-in prior to the show.
 - e) Dairy goats must be purchased by the exhibitor before 2 years of age or first freshening, whichever comes first. This also applies to exhibitors leasing dairy goats.
 - f) All Does 2 years and older must be in milk.
 - g) Two goats per breed per class may be entered.
 - h) If there is a milking competition, ADGA Official Milking Competition rules will be used. Exhibitors will be limited to 2 entries. Competition will involve 3 milkings and be scored on quantity of milk, butterfat, and days of lactation. The schedule is to be posted on Saturday of the fair week as well as on the sign-up sheet.
 - i) Showmanship will follow the ADGA scorecard:
 - Appearance of Animals – 40 points
 - Appearance of Exhibitor – 10 points
 - Showing Animal in the Ring – 50 points
 - Total of 100 points

Department 4EE – Meat Goats

- 1) General Rules and Regulations
 - a) Bucks will be brought in on day of show and returned immediately.
 - b) Meat goats will be allowed to have horns. Horns must be tipped blunt. Blunting (also called tipping) simply means removing the pointed tip of the horn. This can be done with a pair of hoof trimmers. Only a small amount of horn should be removed to prevent bleeding. For the safety of the exhibitors, sharp horns will not be allowed. The disbudding of market goats is encouraged, but not required. All male market goats must be castrated and healed prior to the show.
 - c) All market goats must be positively identified with a state 4-H ear tag.
 - d) All market goats must be less than 1 year of age as of the show date and owned by the exhibitor prior to tag-in.
 - e) Each Washington County 4-H/FFA member may tag up to 4 goats, show 3 goats, and sell 2 goats in each section 8 and Section 9.
 - f) Market goats will be weighed prior to the show and will be divided into weight classes of approximate numbers.
 - g) Show officials may disqualify animals from the show that weigh less than 40 pounds or over 115 pounds or appear unhealthy.
 - h) Goats entered in section 8 must be 100% dairy breeds or crosses thereof.
 - i) Goats entered in section 9 are those with 25% or greater meat breed genetics.
 - j) All market goats must be shown in uniformity short hair and have no more than $\frac{3}{4}$ inch growth.
 - k) Meat goat showmanship
 - i) Animals must be entered in market classes or breeding meat.
 - ii) Exhibitors may use sheep or goat halters and collars.
 - iii) Showmanship breakdown as follows:
 - (1) 20% fitting of animal
 - (2) 50% performance in show ring
 - (3) 20% knowledge
 - (4) 10% personal appearance of show person
 - l) Commercial meat goats
 - i) 4-H/FFA commercial goats must be tagged at market goat tagging.
 - ii) Classes open to any non-registered commercial meat goat (any breed or crosses).
 - iii) Goats with natural horns must be tipped.

- iv) Doe kids entered in 4-H/FFA market show may not be shown in commercial classes.
- v) Exhibitor may use halters and collars.
- vi) Exhibitors may enter no more than two animals per class.
- vii) All animals may have permanent tag or tattoo.
- m) Registered Boer & Kiko
 - i) All Boer and Kiko goats must be registered with respective breed associations.
 - ii) Animals with natural horns must be tipped.
 - iii) Full blood and pure bred $\frac{15}{16}$ or greater will show together.
 - iv) Percentage class $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{3}{4}$, and $\frac{7}{8}$ will show together.

 - f) Unused pens by an exhibitor will result in the equal reduction of rabbits allowed to show.
 - g) Only exhibitors and show officials will be permitted within the judging area.
 - h) Any substitution must be made through the superintendent prior to the show. Any substitution must be of the same breed, variety and class.
 - i) Rabbits/cavies will be judged by ARBA standards.
 - j) A mixed breed class will be separate.
 - k) Fur will be decided during breed classes.
 - l) Cavies will be a one day show due to housing conditions that may be detrimental to their health.
 - m) 4H-5-1 – Meat Pen
 - i) Rabbits can be mixed breed as long as they are still uniform in size, shape and color. If there is a tie between sets, breed standards will be followed.
 - ii) Age limit not over 80 days, weight limit not over 6 pounds or under 3.5 pounds for the show.
 - iii) Rabbits not within the weight limits on the show day may show, but not be champion or reserve.
 - iv) All breeds competing together.
 - v) One entry per exhibitor
 - vi) Entry must be purchased or raised and in possession by 8 weeks of age.
 - vii) Rabbits must be tattooed.
 - viii) Four may be purchased or raised and show three.

Department 4I – Horse & Pony

- 1) General Rules and Regulations
 - a) All participants must be enrolled in 4-H/FFA prior to June 1 of the current year.
 - b) All animals must be owned or leased prior to June 1 of the current year.
 - c) Animals are to be brought in the day of the show and taken home the same day.
 - d) No stalls will be provided for the animals.
 - e) All animals are to be kept in designated areas.
 - f) Riders are limited to showing 2 different animals for a combined total of 8 classes. Champion ribbons will be awarded to the exhibitor that has accumulated the most points during the day in the three separate divisions: Walk/Trot, Junior and Senior Divisions. No Over-All High Point will be awarded.
 - g) Champion ribbons will be awarded to the first place exhibitor in both the Junior and Senior Grooming and Showmanship class.
 - h) No grand champion will be selected.
 - i) Exhibitor must get written approval from the superintendent that the horse show area has been cleaned before a premium check will be issued.
 - j) Horse and Pony Project Identification Cards (4-H 117) must be registered in the 4-H office by June 1 of the current year.
 - k) The Maryland 4-H Horse and Pony Rule Book will apply unless specific changes are specified. In the absence of a specific 4-H rule, AQHA and USEF rules will apply.
 - l) All exhibitors, English and Western, must wear headgear passing ASTM standards when mounted. Headgear must carry the SEI seal. Boots with heels are required when mounted.
 - m) Harnesses must be secured and properly fitted.
 - n) Exhibitors, both English and Western, must have passed Horsemanship Standards 1, 2, and riding level 3.
 - i) Age divisions:
 - (a) Junior classes, 8-13 years of age
 - (b) Senior classes, 14 years and older
 - o) Walk-Trot classes are for those riders who are in their 1st or 2nd year of showing.
 - p) Riders entering in the Walk-Trot classes are limited to those classes.
 - q) 4I-3-1 – Horsemanship Skillathon – Open to all 4-H and FFA.

- 2) Rules for Model Horse Show
 - a) To be eligible to enter, each contestant must be a 4-H member in good standing with their club
 - b) Be a good sport. It's not about how well you did or did not do, it is about how much fun you and everyone else had doing it.
 - c) Entrants are encouraged to pre-register. Once registered, each entrant will be given table space around the perimeter of the show area as their staging area to prepare their horses for classes.
 - d) Leg tags are required for each horse. These consist of small white blank tags that can be purchased at local office supply stores (for example, see Staples item number 721907). On one side of the tag, the entrant's name and horse's name should be printed. On the other side, the horse's breed should be printed. The tag should be tied to the horse's left hind leg. Breed side faces up when horses are judged.
 - e) Entrants are limited to 1 entry per performance class. Each performance class involves setting up a diorama-type scene that fits with the class description. The scene must include a model horse and complete tack set. Maximum size for each scene is 2' wide by 2' long. These scenes must be made entirely by the 4-H exhibitor and set up on the show table by the exhibitor with no outside assistance.
 - f) Entrants are limited to 2 entries per halter class. During the show, as each class is called, entrants will bring their entry(s) to the judging table making sure that the leg tag is placed breed side up. The entrants are judged on how well the selected horse meets the conformation standards for the designated breed. However, although called a halter class, horses are shown without halters. Once placings are announced, entrants will retrieve their horses and the next class will be called.
 - g) All model horses must be original finish Breyers. No customized or repainted models allowed.
 - h) The judge's decision is final in all classes.
 - i) No running or touching models is allowed in the show area. Parents please watch your children in order to maintain an orderly environment.

All Exhibitors must comply with all Washington County Ag Expo & Fair rules and regulations. Failure to comply may disqualify the entry and require that it be removed from the fairgrounds.

Department 4J-Dogs

- 1) General Rules and Regulations
 - a) First Year Classes are only open to Exhibitors who are in their first year of training and/or exhibiting any dog.
 - b) Good sportsmanship will be expected of all exhibitors and all family members. NON-EXHIBITORS SHOULD NOT APPROACH JUDGES. Address all concerns and questions to the show superintendent. The judge and/or superintendent may excuse from the ring or fairgrounds any dog or handler who falls into these categories: (a) any handler who willfully interferes with another participant or their dog; (b) any dog which cannot be controlled by its handler; (c) any obviously ill or lame dog; (d) any handler who abuses their dog in or out of the ring; (e) a dog determined to be out-of-control.
 - c) An Exhibitor may exhibit in a class above their age level, but not below their age level. If an exhibitor competes in an AKC, UKC, or any other similarly sanctioned dog event, they must compete at or above that same level in all 4-H events.
 - d) When possible, except as expressly altered in these rules, the American Kennel Club (AKC) Regulations will be used as the standard for judging.
 - e) Eligibility: Dogs exhibited must have been trained by the Exhibitor. Exhibitor’s project must be identified to the 4-H office by June 1 of the current year. Any 4-H project dog, whether registered/unregistered purebred or mixed bred, may be entered. All dogs shall be immunized and have a valid rabies vaccination. Rabies vaccination number and expiration date must be listed on the dog registration form. Dogs without a valid rabies vaccination will not be allowed to show. Female dogs in season will not be allowed to be shown.
 - f) The same dog may be shown by up to two 4-H members in separate sections (i.e. obedience, rally, fitting and showing). It cannot be shown in the same section by more than one member
 - g) Awards: Premiums/ribbons will be awarded to 1st thru 5th place in each class. Trophies and/or prizes will be awarded to the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion in each Section: Obedience, Fitting and Showmanship, and (Rally). **TIES FOR THE TITLE OF GRAND CHAMPION AND/OR RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION IN ALL SECTIONS WILL BE BROKEN AT THE DISCRETION OF THE JUDGE.**

2) Section I – Obedience

- a) An Exhibitor may show two (2) dogs in different obedience classes in the same age's division (not more than one (1) per class). A dog that has won an obedience class with an AKC qualifying score in a previous Ag Expo and Fair show may not compete in that same class again. Once a dog advances to a higher level it cannot move back to a lower level.
- b) All exercises will be done individually except the long sit and long down (these will be done in convenient groups).
- c) **Class Descriptions** – Exercises and judging criteria will follow AKC guidelines and rules that are in effect as of January 1 of current year unless modified and published in the current Ag Expo and Fair catalog.
 - i) **First Year Pre-Novice Obedience:** Exhibitors who are in their first year of training and/or exhibiting ANY dog. All work will be done on leash, including stays. Exercises and judging criteria will follow AKC rules that are in effect of as of January 1 of the current year.
 - ii) **Pre-Novice Obedience:** Dogs which have earned one (1) leg towards their CD (Companion Dog) title from AKC or an equivalent title from another registry (U-CD from UKC), may not complete in this class. All work will be done on leash, including the stays. Exercises and judging criteria will follow AKC rules that are in effect of as of January 1 of the current year.
 - iii) **Novice Obedience:** Dogs which have earned a C.D. (Companion Dog) title from the AKC or an equivalent title from another registry (e.g. U-CD from UKC) may not compete in this class. Exercises and judging criteria will follow AKC rules that are in effect of as of January 1 of the current year.
 - iv) **Graduate Novice Obedience:** Dogs which have not obtained one (1) leg toward CDX (Companion Dog Excellent) title from the AKC or equivalent title from another registry but have obtained a CD title from the AKC or equivalent title from another registry are eligible to compete in this class. Exercises and judging criteria will follow AKC rules that are in effect of as of January 1 of the current year.
 - v) **Open Obedience:** These classes represent advanced obedience and any Exhibitor who has trained a dog to compete in the respective class exercises may compete in this class. All entries in the open classes must indicate the appropriate dog jump heights (Broad and High). Exhibitors who are showing at this level may continue showing at this level indefinitely. Exercises and judging criteria will follow AKC rules that are in effect of as of January 1 of the current year.

3) Section II – Fitting and Showmanship

- a) All fitting (grooming) must be done by the Exhibitor except where help is needed with specialized breed grooming (e.g. clipping, stripping, etc.). Artificial preparations such as powder or cornstarch, etc. may NOT be left on the dog.
- b) Dogs must be clean (including their ears) with coats well brushed and free of mats. Dogs should be free of external parasites. Allowances may be made by the judge for unavoidable surface dirt due to wet weather.
- c) Exhibitors should be able to show their dogs at an appropriate gait, show the dog's bite upon judge's request and stand their dogs in an acceptable

pose to permit examination by judge. Exhibitors should be able to answer questions on the care, grooming, and background of their breed(s).

- d) Fitting of Dog (body condition, grooming) and Showing in the Ring (performance of dog, presentation of dog, alertness of exhibitor, personal appearance of the exhibitor, and knowledge of the breed and overall dog care and training) will be judged.
- e) Performance of the dog shall not count against the Exhibitor unless in the Judge's opinion it interferes with another exhibitor's dog. The ability of the exhibitor to show their dog to its best advantage, whether the dog is cooperating or not, will be evaluated. It is expected that the exhibitor will have worked with their dog adequately prior to the show and have developed a working relationship with the dog.
- f) **Class Descriptions –**
 - i) **First Year Novice:** Exhibitors who are in their first year of training and/or exhibiting ANY dog. Fitting and Showing exhibitors who are regarded as Open Junior Handlers by the AKC as of July 1 of the current year are not eligible for this class.
 - ii) **Novice:** Exhibitors (Handlers) who have previously placed 1st in a Novice Fitting & Showmanship class are not eligible for this class and must compete in the appropriate Open Fitting and Showmanship class. Exception – 1st year Fitting and Showmanship Exhibitors who are regarded as Open Junior Handlers by the AKC as of July 1 of the current year are not eligible for this class.
 - iii) **Open:** This class represents advanced fitting and showmanship. Once an exhibitor completes in an open Fitting and Showmanship class, they may not compete in a Novice Fitting and Showmanship class at a future Ag Expo and Fair show.

4) Section III – Rally

- a) An Exhibitor may show 2 dogs in different Rally classes in the same age division (not more than one per class). A dog that has won a Rally class in a previous Ag Expo and Fair show may not complete in that same class again. The dog must move up to a higher Rally class (i.e. Novice to Advanced) or the Exhibitor must move to the next age level (i.e. Junior to Intermediate). Once a dog advances to a higher level it cannot move back to a lower level.
- b) All course runs will be done individually.
- c) Exercises and Judging Criteria for all divisions will follow AKC rules that are in effect as of January 1 of the current year.
- d) **Class Descriptions –**
 - i) **Novice Rally:** All work will be done on leash. Dogs which have earned their RN (Rally Novice) title from AKC or an equivalent title from another registry may not compete in this class.
 - ii) **Advanced Rally:** All work will be done off leash. Dogs which have earned their RA (Rally Advanced) title from AKC or an equivalent title from another registry may not compete in this class.
 - iii) **Excellent A Rally:** All work, with the exception of the Honor Exercises will be done off leash. Dogs which have won this class, with a qualifying score in prior years or have earned their RE (Rally Excellent) title from AKC or an equivalent title from another registry may not compete in this class.

- iv) **Excellent B Rally:** All work, with the exception of the Honor Exercise, is done off leash. This class is for dogs that have won an Excellent A class at the Ag Expo and Fair show event in prior years with a qualifying score or have the AKC RE (Rally Excellent) title.

 - c) Exhibit placings are at the judge’s discretion. This includes the oral interview as well as the completed exhibit.
 - d) Husbandry:
 - i) Any exhibit that demonstrates the management, health and/or care in raising alpacas as an agricultural livestock industry.
 - e) Therapeutic Activities, (Other Opportunities With Alpacas):
 - i) No specific rules or regulations.
 - f) Suri and Huacaya Fleece Exhibits:
 - i) All fleeces shown must meet AOBA show rules for preparation and presentation of show fleeces.
 - g) Felted Crafts:
 - i) all projects must be constructed of natural animal fiber (e.g.: alpaca, sheep wool, etc.).
 - ii) Exhibitor’s tag must include the fiber content.
 - h) Knit, Crocheted and Woven Crafts:
 - i) Exhibit shows a project that can be made of alpaca products (yarn, roving, raw fleece etc.). It does not have to be made of alpaca.
 - ii) Exhibitor’s tag must include the fiber content.
 - i) Hand Spun Crafts:
 - i) All hand spun yarn is to be made of animal fiber (alpaca, sheep’s wool, etc.)
 - ii) Exhibitor’s tag must include the fiber content.
 - j) Hand dyed Crafts:
 - i) Exhibits will include a natural fiber that has been hand dyed by exhibitor. This may include any natural animal fiber.
 - ii) Exhibitor’s tag must include the fiber content.
 - k) Alpaca Garment:
 - i) Exhibit includes an article of clothing that has been made by the exhibitor. This may include, but is not limited to, mittens, scarf, hat, vest, jacket, socks). The exhibit must be made of alpaca.
 - ii) Exhibit may, but is not limited to, construction that is sewn, knitted, crochet or felted.
 - l) Other Related Alpaca Crafts:
 - i) Exhibitor may submit any creative projects beyond the scope of those listed in Classes 0001-0015.

- m) Alpaca Related Creative Writings:
 - i) Exhibitor may submit any creative writing that relates to alpacas. Examples may include, but are not limited to poems, essays and stories.
 - ii) Exhibits must be submitted in an easy to read format (ie: neatly hand written in ink or typed)
- n) Alpaca Related Creative Arts:
 - i) Exhibitor may submit any creative art project that relates to alpacas. This may include, but not be limited to, drawings, photographs, paintings, wood projects, etc.
- o) Other Related Projects:
 - i) Exhibitors may submit any alpaca related projects beyond those described in classes 0001-0018.
- p) Obstacle Course:
 - i) All alpacas participating in the obstacle course must be ARI registered alpacas.
 - ii) All alpacas must be owned or leased prior to June 1 of current year.
 - iii) All exhibitors must be enrolled in 4-H/FFA.
 - iv) Any substitutions must be made through the superintendent prior to the show.

Department 4N – Food Preservation

- 1) General Rules and Regulations
 - a) The lids of all exhibit jars must be rust free.
 - b) Jars that become unsealed during the fair will be discarded and the premium forfeited.
 - c) All canned and preserved products must be exhibited in clean, clear standard canning jars, quart or pint size and jellies in half pint/pint glasses with screw band lid.
 - d) Food coloring may not be added to canned products.
 - e) No jar may be exhibited more than once.
 - f) Soft spread definitions:
 - i) Jelly – made from strained fruit juice and sugar cooked together. Jelly is crystal clear and shimmering; firm enough to hold its shape outside the jar, yet soft enough to spread easily.
 - ii) Jam – Made by cooking crushed or chopped fruit with sugar. Jams can be made from one fruit or a combination of fruits. They should be firm but spread easily; jams do not hold the shape of the jar.
 - iii) Butter – made by cooking fruit pulp and sugar to a thick consistency that will spread easily. Spices may be added.
 - iv) Preserves – made by cooking fruit and sugar so that the fruit retains its shape, is clear, shiny, tender, and plump. The syrup is clear and varies from the thickness of honey to that of soft jelly.
 - v) Conserves – jam-like products made by cooking two or more fruits with sugar. A true conserve contains raisins and nuts.
 - vi) Marmalades – soft-fruit jellies containing small pieces of fruit and citrus peel evenly suspended in the transparent jelly. They are similar in structure to jams.

 - a) 4-H/FFA members may not enter the same single exhibit in both a 4-H/FFA class and an open class.
 - b) No exhibits will be accepted that require refrigeration.
 - c) Exhibit items on a sturdy white disposable plate placed in a zip lock type bag.
 - d) Exhibits too large for a zip lock type bag may be covered with plastic wrap.
 - e) Cookie definitions:
 - i) Bar – Stiff dough spread in flat pan. Baked, cooled and cut into bars.
 - ii) Drop – Soft dough dropped from spoon onto cookie sheet.
 - iii) Rolled – Stiff dough rolled thin and cut into desired shapes.
 - iv) Refrigerator – Stiff dough shaped into rolls, wrapped, chilled well in refrigerator so that it can be cut into thin slices.
 - v) Molded – Stiff dough rolled between hands into balls, logs, crescents, etc.
 - vi) Pressed – Dough forced through a cookie press/pastry tube into various shapes.
 - f) All Champion and Reserve Champion baked goods exhibited will be sold at the 4-H bake/cake auction. 1st and 2nd place will be sold at the baked goods table in the home arts building on entry/judging day and Friday.
 - g) No commercial mixes or convenience foods are to be used for classes 4O-1-4 thru 4O-1-16
 - h) Recipe must be included with all baked items.
 - i) Cakes
 - i) A whole cake makes an exhibit
 - ii) Exhibit cakes on stiff cardboard 2" larger than cake
 - iii) 4O-1-17 – Cake made with cake mix – Exhibitor must use box mix as a base, adding fruits, nuts, puddings, chocolate chips, or other ingredients.
 - j) Cookies
 - i) Exhibit consists of 6 cookies

- k) Candy
 - i) Exhibit consists of 6 pieces of candy.
- l) Breads

 - v) Nothing in the booth may be taller than the sides of the booth where the item is placed.
 - vi) Items must be secured to the booth. Ag Expo is not responsible for theft or damage.
 - vii) The club or chapter name must be a prominent part of the booth as well as the 4-H Clover/FFA Emblem.
 - viii) Booths must include an “AA Statement” somewhere in the booth.
 - ix) The club name, address, city, county, club leader’s name, address and phone number must be clearly printed on a card and securely attached to the back side of the booth in the upper right corner.
 - x) Booths will be judged on their own merit using the Danish system.
 - xi) Awards
 - (1) Ribbons and premiums will be awarded to each exhibit.
 - (2) 2 champion booths will be selected to go to the Maryland State Fair and each will receive a rosette.

- e) 4-H Club and FFA Chapter Banners
 - i) Banner may be constructed of any type of durable material with any type of application that can be folded or rolled.
 - ii) Design must be on one side only.
 - iii) Each year 4-H/FFA banners will have a theme. Please contact the extension educator for more information.
 - iv) Banners must be 50 inches wide and 30 inches high.
 - v) Banners must be constructed to hang on a rod or pole no longer than 56 inches long provided by the exhibitor.
 - vi) The club or chapter name must be a prominent part of the banner as well as the 4-H clover/FFA emblem.
 - vii) Banners will be judged using the same criteria and point system as for booths.
 - viii) All 1st place banners are eligible for Maryland State Fair.
 - ix) The club name, city, county, club leader's name, address and phone number and AA Statement must be clearly printed on a card and securely attached to the back side of the banner.
